## HOW TO APPLY

Apply electronically at [www.monroecc.edu/go/admissions](http://www.monroecc.edu/go/admissions) or download a paper application, enclose a \$20 application fee (non-refundable) and mail to:

**Currently enrolled high school students** should bring completed application and fee to their high school counseling office (your high school will attach your transcript and mail it directly to us). If you choose to apply on-line, please request a transcript from your high school to be sent to MCC.

## GENERAL INFORMATION

- **Tuition.** \$1,500 a semester, or \$125 per credit hour for part-time students (under 12 credit hours per semester). Subject to change.
- **Financial Aid.** Available to matriculated students (students who have been accepted into a degree program), including part-time. Visit [www.monroecc.edu/go/finaid](http://www.monroecc.edu/go/finaid) or call the Financial Aid Office at 585.292.2050.
- **Calendar.** Fall semester begins the first week of September. Spring semester starts the fourth week of January. Summer sessions (day and evening) begin late May and early July. Intersession runs the first three weeks in January.

For best availability of programs, apply early.

## STEP 1. CHOOSE A PROGRAM

If you know the college you want to transfer to, have a minimum high school GPA of 85, limited prior college credits, and plan to attend MCC full time, consider a 2+2 Dual Admission program.

## STEP 2. APPLY ONLINE

Apply online at [www.monroecc.edu/go/admissions](http://www.monroecc.edu/go/admissions). Or use the attached form, enclose your \$20 fee (non-refundable), and mail to Monroe Community College, PO Box 92808, Rochester, NY 14692-8908.

## STEP 3. SEND US YOUR OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPTS

### High School Transcripts

- Have your high school send directly to MCC.
- GED recipients, enclose your GED Score Report and your high school transcript. Your GED Score Report can be photocopied.

### College Transcripts

Contact all colleges you have attended and request that they forward a final, official transcript directly to the MCC Admissions Office.

## STEP 4. SEND YOUR IMMUNIZATION RECORDS TO THE HEALTH OFFICE

New York State Public Health Law 2165 requires students born after January 1, 1957 to provide proof of measles/mumps/rubella immunization (MMR). Bring your records to the MCC Health Office or mail them to Health Office, Monroe Community College, 1000 E. Henrietta Rd., Rochester, NY 14623.

## STEP 5. TAKE THE PLACEMENT TEST

Take the MCC Accuplacer Placement Test. For placement test times and information call 585.292.2290 (Brighton Campus) or 585.262.1619 (Damon City Campus). For a review packet, visit [www.monroecc.edu/go/testing](http://www.monroecc.edu/go/testing).

*We may be able to waive the Placement Test if you submit SAT scores of 500 or better in Mathematics and Critical Reading, or ACT scores of 21 or better in Mathematics and English. Waivers decided on a case-by-case basis.*

### HOW TO CHECK ON THE STATUS OF YOUR APPLICATION

Call the MCC automated inquiry system at 585.292.2200.

- Press 1 to access the system.
- Enter your Student Number or Social Security Number.
- Press 1 to verify.
- Press 1 to check your application status. Or press 2 to get a list of documents in your file.

## NEXT STEPS AFTER APPLYING

1. **Admissions Interview.** Optional, but recommended if you have questions. To schedule, call 585.292.2200.
2. **Apply for Financial Aid.** Complete a Financial Aid application online at [www.monroecc.edu/go/financialaid](http://www.monroecc.edu/go/financialaid) or call 585.292.2050. Complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Financial Aid) as soon as possible after filing your yearly tax return. File the FAFSA electronically at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov).
3. **Advisement and Registration.** After you've been admitted, you'll receive information about advisement and registration. Most new students are required to go through academic advisement before registering. For information, call 585.292.2298 (Brighton Campus) or 585.262.1753 (Damon City Campus). Or, visit [www.monroecc.edu/go/student-services](http://www.monroecc.edu/go/student-services) and click on Advising.

## TRANSFERRING TO THE HIGHLY SELECTIVE COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY

Services and advisement are available to assist students in becoming stronger candidates for admission to highly selective four-year institutions. The Career Center has partnered with Amherst College, Cornell University, and Mount Holyoke College to offer specialized programming leading to students becoming candidates for admission to these highly selective and competitive institutions.

Relationships with other highly selective colleges and universities, including Columbia University, Smith College, UNC Chapel Hill, and the University of Michigan, have also grown out of what was started by the Jack Kent Cooke Foundation grant. While admission to any transfer institution is not guaranteed, except for those students enrolled in a 2+2 dual admission program, assistance is provided by the Career Center that will make the student a stronger candidate for admission to the college of their choice.
