

# PROGRAM ANNOUNCEMENT

## *Patrol Rifle Instructor Course*

**May 29 - May 31, 2012**

**8:30 AM to 4:30 PM**

The Public Safety Training Center in partnership with the Monroe County Sheriff's Office will be conducting the Patrol Rifle Instructor Course at the above dates and times. This three day course will be held at Monroe Community College's Rush Range, 492 Stonybrook Road, Rush, NY 14543. Class is limited to 12 participants.

This course is designed to train and prepare the Firearms Instructor to be a Patrol Rifle instructor. This IS NOT a shooting school and is not designed to teach officers how to shoot. Students who attend this Patrol Rifle Instructor School are expected to have a basic knowledge of the Patrol Rifle used and be able to safely and accurately use them. Without this basic background, students may find difficulty in keeping pace with the instruction, practical exercises, and successful completion of the proficiency assessments.

We expect all students to demonstrate safe gun handling at all times. Students must be physically capable of quickly and safely assuming the standing, kneeling, sitting, and prone positions, maintaining them for a period of time, and safely recovering from them without assistance. The ability to field strip and reassemble the duty firearm is a must as well. This is not a familiarization course.

All participants are required to score 75% of the course standards to successfully complete the course. All participants must be a current NYS Firearms Instructor. Must have a solid background with the Patrol Rifle and possess the ability to make accurate rifle sight adjustments, field strip, reassemble, load and unload their respective rifles, prior to arrival. Students will design a tactical course of fire and are responsible for developing a lesson plan and running fellow students through their course at the end of the training period.

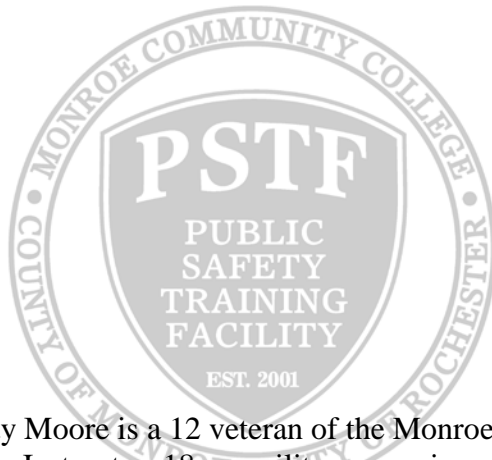
- Developing Courses of fire
- Zero procedures to include "How to zero a pool gun"
- Distance shooting
- Close Quarters Shooting
- Techniques and tactics associated with the AR style rifle
- Safety considerations when conducting "live fire" Shooting on the Move courses
- Low Light Safety considerations
- Safety considerations in using steel targets
- Transition drills
- Reloading under stress "standards drills"

**Required Equipment:**

- AR Style Rifle with Tactical Sling and Light
- 3 Rifle Magazines
- 600 Rounds Practice Ammunition
- Duty Pistol with Duty Holster
- 3 Pistol Magazines
- 100 Rounds of Duty Pistol Ammunition
- Head Gear (Ball Cap, Hat)
- “Wrap-Around” protective glasses or Goggles, no exceptions
- Ear Protection
- Patrol Vest
- Rain Gear
- Water

- Sight adjustment tool
- Energy bar or snacks
- Rain Pants and Jacket
- Duty Belt
- AR-Magazine Holster
- Knee Pads

Successful completion of this course will be worth 1.5 college credits from Monroe Community College.

**Tuition for this course is \$192.00 per person plus \$54.50 in student fees.** *A certificate of residency from out-of-Monroe county residents is required in order to avoid double tuition billing.* You will be billed at the completion of the course. It will not be necessary to send a check or voucher prior to class.
